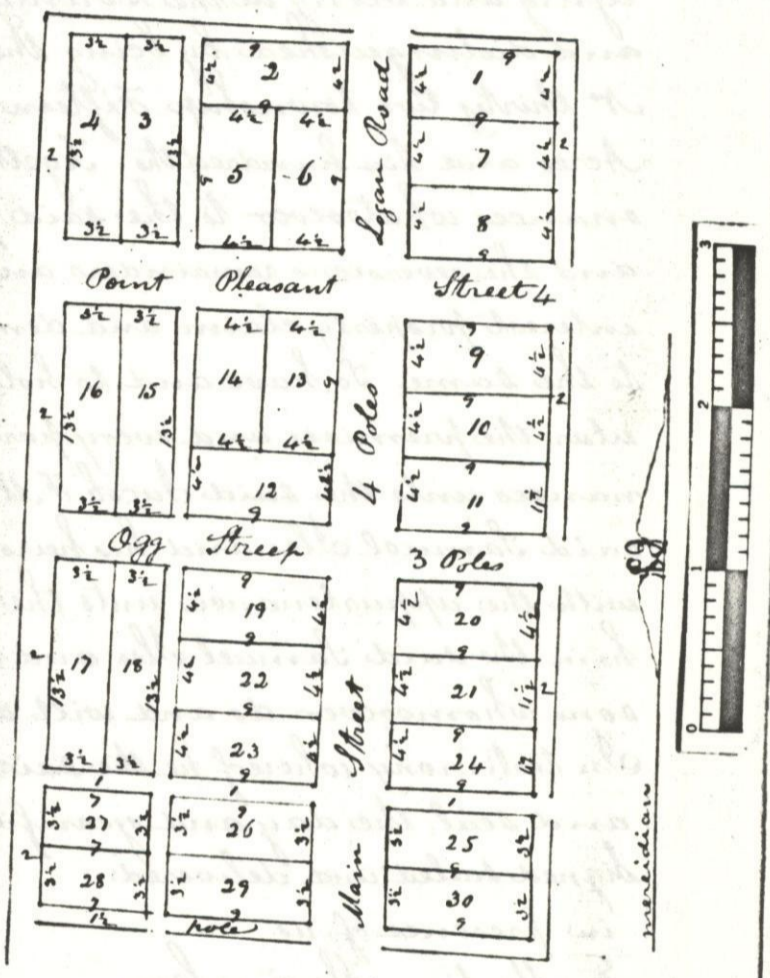

A Plan of the survey of the Town of Heaborough in the Township of Washington in the County of Hocking on the 12th day of April A.D. 1838 at the request of Henry Hles the following is the descriptive notes of said Town beginning twenty ^{two} poles and twenty one links South of the North West corner of Section N^o 22 T^o N^o 13 R^o N^o 17 thence South to the South West corner of Lot N^o 28 for a further description see plat Main Street is four poles wide and bears N 51^o W the other Streets and alley in the same proportion Lots N^o 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 & 30 contain 24 poles and $\frac{57}{100}$ the lots that has stones set at their corners are as follows N^o 1 N.E. 2 N.E. 4 N.W. 4 S.W. 6 S.E. 8 S.E. 13 N.E. 16 N.W. 17 S.W. 20 S.E. 28 S.W. 30 S.E. Public lots are nine and twenty nine.
