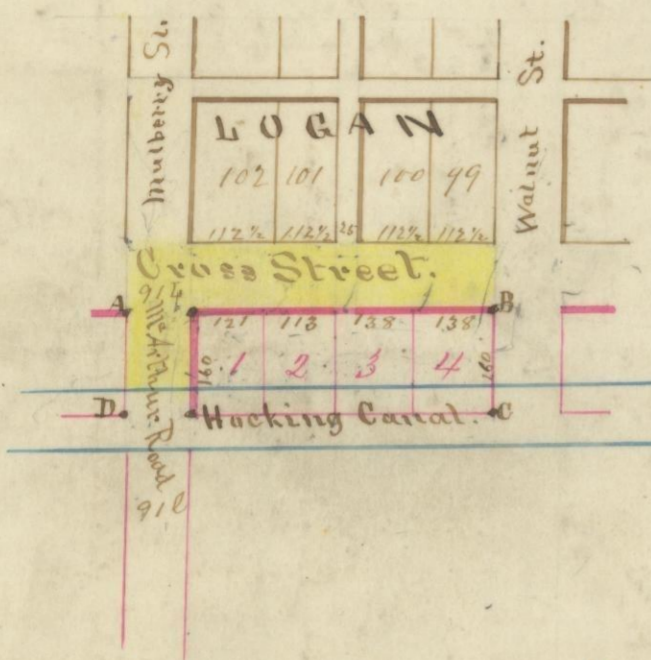


Worthington Executors' Addition to the Town of Logan.

Description. - The parallelogram A, B, C, & D is the plat now recorded. The widths of the streets and alleys and the dimensions of the lots are noted in links of a four pole chain, and the corners of the streets and sides of the lots are all noted on the plat, and stones and stones are planted where noted. The black lines represent part of the town of Logan, The State of Ohio Hocking County ss.

The undersigned as executors of the late Governor Thomas Worthington, do hereby acknowledge the above plat and description to be our act and deed and desire that the same may be

recorded. Witness our hands and seals this 28 day of October AD 1843 Eleanor Worthington signing and sealing by James T. Worthington her attorney.
