Sue Morgan was concerned about an agreement, and if someone benefits from this event other than HHTA. Commissioner Ogle replied to Sue that ABM, the vendor performing the contracted work of the HVAC system, had subcontracted out BHD. This is not a decision of the boards, this is strictly up to the ABM. Commissioner Ogle also directed Sue to ask the Board of DD the questions pertaining to the purchase of that building. The board of DD purchased, updated, and sold that building, the Board's only play in the exchange was strictly due to the fact that all public buildings must be in the Commissioners name. There was no input beyond that.

Auditor Chris Robers introduced the intern for the Auditor's office, Faith Bahner. She will be with the County until August. She is studying Economics major at OU.

Commissioner Ogle apologized for the miscommunication on Glen's agenda appointment, so public hearing #1 can continue. The board will work it out with Glen to make sure the hearing can continue soon. Sue Morgan wanted to clarify the time frames between hearing 1 and 2, but the board is uncertain of those specific requirements.
