GLEN CRIPPEN:

Glen Crippen Director of Housing and Community Development at HAPCAP presented the Commissioners with preformed Environmental Reviews on behalf of Metropolitan Housing, proposed to spend HUD dollars through their Capital Improvements budget for three projects to improve their properties. The County certifies that the Environmental Review is completed.

First project is parking lot replacement at Logan Village. Glen gives a breakdown of what an Environmental Review encloses.

Commissioner Ogle stopped Mr. Crippen and discussed her concerns. Ogle comments that if Mr. Blatchley wanted these signatures, then she feels he should be presenting them, out of respect. Mr. Crippen replied that he was unaware, and apologized. Crippen will discuss this with Mr. Blatchley, and have him accompany during the next visit to represent the Environmental Reviews for signature.

Commissioner Ogle requested information from Mr. Crippen while he was present. She asked for an update on Laurelville. Crippen replied that they are in the process of obtaining Engineer firms, and the

Environmental Review is complete. Crippen stated that they'll try to get work done this fall, and then finish up next spring and summer. This is a two-year grant, and only 7 months in.
