GENERAL BUISNESS

Commissioner Ogle discussed the reasoning for today's agenda. The Commissioners are working on the budget to survive the rest of the year. Commissioner Dickerson adds that the State cut budgets 20%, with no discussion of help for local governments. Commissioner Waugh said the hardest thing is to cut budgets, but after some hesitation there has to be some budget cuts. Commissioner Ogle said that the Board discussed initially cutting the budget 5% but after a reevaluation, the Board will have to move forward with a 10% budget cut.

Motion by Sandra Ogle and seconded by Jeff Dickerson for General Fund budgets to be cut 10% for the remainder of 2020.

Vote: Ogle, yea, Dickerson, yea, Waugh, yea.

Audie Wykle from Regional Planning asked the Commissioners if each department gets to decide where the 10% cut will come from within their department. Commissioner Ogle said yes, each elected official will determine how that cut will be taken from their budget.

Treasurer Diane Sargent asked how insurance works if an employee drops below their allowed hours for insurance. After discussion with the Prosecutor Ben Fickel it was determined that this will be looked into further.

Commissioner Dickerson asked if it was possible for the Board of Commissioners to pass a motion for insurance coverage to continue if the employee's hours dropped below 30. Prosecutor Ben Fickel said the Board could make that request. Fickel added them himself and Auditor Ken Wilson attended a

Webinar that discussed layoffs, budget cuts, etc. There was a program available called Shared Works, and perhaps more information from Jody Walker of Job and Family Services could help.

Major Caleb Moritz asked for clarification on elected officials' salaries being off limits during budget cuts. Prosecutor Ben Fickel replied that was correct, that you cannot change elected officials' salaries.

Major Moritz and the Commissioners discuss the jail bill and the budget it falls under, and discuss numbers.

The next group of elected officials and department heads entered.

Commissioner Ogle discussed the budget cut with the group. Commissioner Dickerson added that the end goal was to avoid a fiscal watch by the state at the end of year.

Recorder Sandy Hunt mentions will very little budget line items, she will have difficulty coming up with where to make these cuts. Commissioner Ogle suggests salary/benefits.

Auditor Ken Wilson discusses budget provisions and numbers. The current standings are 60 days behind, with no telling as to how hard the County will be impacted yet.

After some discussion involving the CARES Act monies the County received, Judge Moses discussed some scenarios of avoiding cuts and using the CARES Act monies to reimburse salaries during COVID.

Commissioner Ogle discussed budget with the Judges, Board of Elections, and Veterans office.

Judge Jonah Saving talked about the increase in tourists in the area, and the potential for sales tax to amp up in upcoming numbers.

Board of Elections discussed the security grant they received and improvements they've been making with the grant money. This money was from a grant, not asked for from the Commissioners, and is not general fund money. These are updates are strictly from the security grant received.

Bailey Simons, Executive Director of CIC, asked the Commissioners if the motion still stands for the budget cut of 10%. Commissioner Ogle replied yes, until she sees otherwise. Simons asked Dickerson and Waugh if they also agreed, in which Dickerson and Waugh replied they also agreed.

Further discussion between Auditor Ken Wilson, Judge Jonah Saving, Judge Fred Moses, and the Commissioners concluded that more discussion about CARES Act monies is needed before a budget cut is put into action.

Commissioner Dickerson put a motion on the floor to delay the 10% budget cuts.

<u>FOR THE RECORD:</u> Motion by Sandra Ogle and seconded by Jeff Dickerson to rescind the current motion for a 10% budget cut based on the information that has been discussed.

Vote: Ogle, yea, Dickerson, yea, Waugh, yea.

Commissioner Waugh apologized on behalf of the board for perhaps pulling the trigger to quickly on budget cuts, but some information was not prominent while making that decision.

Motion by Gary Waugh and seconded by Jeff Dickerson to rescind the motion on the floor by Commissioner Dickerson.

Vote: Ogle, yea, Dickerson, yea, Waugh, yea.

PROSECUTOR BEN FICKEL:

Prosecutor Ben Fickel presented the Commissioners with purchasing a generator for the Murray City Sewer Project. The Engineer on the project would like to directly go to sales and buy without biding out

first, using the DAS program. There is a \$100 fee that can be sent after the COVID crisis. Fickel is requesting a resolution to establish a DAS account and number. During the conversation Major Caleb Moritz notified the Clerk that Hocking County already has an established DAS account.

Commissioner Waugh asked Fickel if he has heard anything about X-Press Underground wanting to go back into mediation. Fickel replied yes, and there has been a few email exchanges were this was mentioned.

Commissioner Dickerson added that the budget takes a lot of time and effort and thanked Commissioner Ogle on spending time going over the budget. Commissioner Ogle said that decisions are made based on the numbers that the Commissioners have in front of them.

DISCUSSION:

Commissioner Dickerson expressed concern over recent surrounding Counties cancelling fairs and festivals, and at this time the Fair Board for Hocking County is still planning a full fair. Dickerson would like to invite the Fair Board President and Secretary to a Commissioners meeting to discuss safety precautions. Commissioner Ogle asked Dickerson if he felt the Commissioners should say no fair. Commissioner Dickerson replied he would hate to step on toes, but safety is a huge concern for food vendors, rides, etc. and if that was what would be best, then yes it could come to that. Commissioner Ogle asked if the Commissioners could legally say no to a County fair. Commissioner Waugh said next step is to talk to the Fair Board and express our concerns.

Motion by Jeff Dickerson and seconded by Sandra Ogle for clerk Kaula Funk to contract the Fair Board President and Secretary and request for their attendance next week.

Commissioner Waugh discussed a phone call with an individual who expressed interest in purchasing the Hull's building. Commissioner Ogle replied that in the past, there was discussion on selling the Hull's building but storage problems came up.

Motion by Sandra Ogle and seconded by Jeff Dickerson for the Hull's building to officially be used for the County record storage and not to be for sale.

It was greatly appreciated and would like to thank them for attending. Commissioner Dickerson agreed and appreciated nobody allowed emotions to take over their actions.
